Bikes and Scooters Guidelines

Safe Travel to and From School

Brabham Primary School encourages safe and active travel to school where appropriate. Walking, riding bikes and using scooters can support student health and wellbeing, however, student safety is our highest priority.

To help keep all students, families and staff safe, the following guidelines are in line with Department of Education expectations and Western Australian road safety laws.

Bikes and Scooters

Students may ride bicycles and non-motorised scooters to and from school with parent or carer permission, provided they demonstrate safe and responsible behaviour.

E-Scooters / Electric Rideables

- Due to Western Australian laws and Department of Education expectations, e-scooters and electric rideables are not permitted
- If students have an electric scooter or other electrical device at school, parents will be called to collect it.

Helmets

- All students riding bikes or scooters must wear an approved helmet as required by law
- Helmets must be securely fitted and worn correctly at all times while riding

On School Grounds

- For the safety of all community members, students must dismount at the school boundary/gates and walk their bike or scooter to the bike rack.
- Riding is not permitted inside school grounds, on pathways, near gates, in carparks or in Kiss and Drop zones
- If using a crosswalk, students must dismount and walk their bike/scooter across.

Bike and Scooter Storage

- Bikes and scooters must be stored in designated bike or scooter racks only
- Students are encouraged to lock their bikes or scooters securely
- Brabham Primary School is not responsible for loss or damage to personal property

Parent Responsibilities

Parents and carers are responsible for deciding whether their child can travel safely and independently to and from school. Families should ensure bikes, scooters and helmets are safe, well maintained and in good working order.

Parents and carers are encouraged to regularly discuss road safety and safe riding expectations with their child:

- Obey road rules and safety signs
- Be aware of surroundings
- Ride in single file
- Signal intentions
- Ride at a controlled speed

School Response to Unsafe Behaviour

Unsafe use of bikes or scooters may result in school consequences in line with school behaviour processes. Repeated unsafe behaviour may result in a student being unable to bring a bike or scooter to school
