

Good Standing Guidelines

The Good Standing Guidelines support a safe, respectful, and inclusive school environment by encouraging students to consistently demonstrate positive behaviour, regular attendance, and active engagement in learning. These guidelines align with the Violence in Schools Policy and the Student Behaviour in Public Schools Policy, alongside the school's Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) framework.

What is Good Standing?

- Good Standing is a status held by all students when they:
- Demonstrate positive behaviour by following school rules and upholding school values
- Behave in ways that promote the physical and emotional safety of themselves and others
- Attend school regularly
- Engage in learning and follow teacher instructions

Students who maintain Good Standing are eligible to participate in excursions, incursions, camps, leadership opportunities, extracurricular activities, and reward events.

Loss of Good Standing

Students may lose Good Standing when they engage in repeated or serious breaches of school expectations, including:

- Violence or aggression (physical, verbal, or online)
- Harassment towards students, staff, or others
- Disruptive or unsafe behaviour that impacts learning
- Refusal to follow school rules and teacher instructions

Zero Tolerance for Violence

In line with the Department's Violence in Schools Policy, Brabham Primary School has a zero-tolerance approach to violence and aggression.

- Any act of physical aggression such as hitting, kicking, or fighting will result in immediate loss of Good Standing and further consequences in line with school behaviour procedures and/or at the discretion of the Principal
- Verbal aggression, threats, or harassment will also result in loss of Good Standing and appropriate intervention
- Parents and carers will be informed and support strategies implemented as required

Loss of Privileges

Students who lose Good Standing will not be able to attend camps, or reward days until improvement is demonstrated.

They may also lose the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities such as choir, dance team, or other school teams.

Loss of Good Standing is determined by school leadership and communicated to students and families.

Regaining Good Standing

Students can restore Good Standing by:

- Reflecting on their behaviour through discussions with staff or leadership
- Demonstrating consistent positive behaviour, attendance, and engagement over an agreed period (typically two to four weeks)
- Following an improvement plan with support from staff where required
- Families will be informed and supported throughout this process to ensure a collaborative approach.
- Final decisions will be confirmed by the Principal

Review and Monitoring

Good Standing is monitored regularly. Students are provided with clear feedback and support to maintain or regain their status in alignment with:

- The school's Positive Behaviour Support framework
- The Resilience Project values and Brabham school values
- The Department of Education's Student Behaviour in Public Schools Policy
- Final decisions will be confirmed by the Principal
