Uniform Guidelines

In line with the WA Department of Education Dress Codes for Students in Public Schools Policy and Procedures, school dress requirements are supported by the School Board in consultation with staff, students and families, and are designed to promote safety, equity, belonging and a positive school identity.

At Brabham Primary School, our dress code supports:

- A strong sense of belonging and school pride
- Student safety, including appropriate footwear and SunSmart practices
- Equity and inclusion for all students
- Readiness for learning through practical, safe and suitable clothing
- Positive representation of our school within the wider community

General Expectations

Students are expected to attend school each day wearing the approved school uniform or clothing that aligns closely with the school's dress code.

Uniform Requirements

- School polo shirt or school faction polo shirt
- School or plain black shorts, skorts, pants, dress or other approved lower-body clothing
- School or plain black jumper/jacket where required
- Broad-brimmed school or plain black hat for outdoor activities (SunSmart)
- Safe, enclosed footwear suitable for learning and physical activity

Footwear

For safety reasons:

- Closed-in shoes or secure sandals are required
- Thongs, slides, backless shoes, high heels or unsafe footwear are not permitted

Hair, Jewellery and Presentation

- Hair should be neat, tidy and safely managed (long hair tied back where appropriate)
- Jewellery should be minimal and safe for school participation
- Items that create safety risks or distraction may be restricted

Cultural, Religious and Medical Considerations

The Department's policy recognises that dress codes must be inclusive and allow reasonable adjustments for:

- Religious requirements
- Cultural dress
- Medical or health needs

Financial Hardship

No student will be excluded from education due to inability to meet dress code costs. Support options may be available for families experiencing financial hardship.

Non-Compliance

Where students are out of dress code:

- Families may be contacted to provide suitable clothing where necessary
- Supportive approaches will be taken before punitive ones
- Safety concerns will always be prioritised
